

Continuum rehab hospital to have ground breaking ceremony

Continuum Rehabilitation Hospital of North Texas will have a groundbreaking ceremony at 10 a.m. April 24 at 3100 Peters Colony Road.

The project will be a 41-bed freestanding inpatient rehabilitation hospital. Plans call for Continuum Rehabilitation Hospital to be a Part-A Medicare certified, licensed hospital specializing in rehabilitation. The facility will provide comprehensive, patient-centered rehabilitation services and will include all private rooms, concierge, spa, wellness and restaurant services.

Outpatient therapy services will feature a large dedicated gym with state-of-the-art equipment, aquatic therapy, and cold and hot emersions baths for treatment of specific conditions. This space would allow each patient to have a private room.

"We are all excited to welcome the Continuum Rehabilitation Hospital of North Texas to Flower Mound. The state-of-the-art, patient-centered facility will offer a variety of medical services in a plush, four-star environment that perfectly recognizes and addresses the quality and convenience needs of the community it is designed to serve," said town spokesman Michael Ryan. "This organization and facility will play a significant role in the development of Flower Mound's burgeoning medical services community, currently anchored by the new Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital of Flower Mound."

The hospital is expected to open April 30. It will feature 103 patient rooms, though the building can increase to more than 200 rooms. It will also include an emergency department and a wide range of medical services, including services for women and children.

The hospital is expected to provide between 500 and 600 jobs by its third year of operation, and it is the first to be constructed of several components of the River Walk at Central Park.

The Continuum agreement was the first to be approved under the town's revised Economic Development Incentive policy, which is designed to stimulate job creation and boost the local economy. The facility is projected to generate 110 jobs and create several million dollars of additional tax base.
