AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF FLOWER MOUND, TEXAS, CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING RESULTS OF A GENERAL AND SPECIAL ELECTION HELD MAY 4, 2019, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING COUNCIL MEMBER PLACES 1, AND 3, AND AMENDING THE HOME RULE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF FLOWER MOUND, TEXAS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Flower Mound, Texas (the "Town"), caused to be published in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, notice of the election held May 4, 2019, for the election of council member places 1, and 3, and to amend the Home Rule Charter of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the appropriate authority of the Town caused to be posted and published, in accordance with applicable laws, notice of said election; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on May 4, 2019, in the Town and in conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas, and the results of said election have been certified and returned by the proper judge and clerks thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has considered the returns of said election held May 4, 2019, and pursuant to state law and Section 5.07 of the Home Rule Charter of the Town, the Council shall canvass and declare the official results; and

WHEREAS, the election returns, duly and legally made, showed that there were cast at said election a total of 3,356 valid and legal votes, of which 2,214 were cast early, and 1,142 were cast on election day; and that each of the candidates and each of the measures in said election received the following votes:
