Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Bryant announced that the Town will have a special recognition at the July 17<sup>th</sup> Council meeting for veterans who were awarded the purple heart.

Mr. Forest reported on the basketball game held at the YMCA with the Town's first responders and wounded warriors.

**G. TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT**

Mr. Stathatos provide an update and discussion on:

Mayor Hayden requested a copy of the full survey report be sent to the entire Council, including a compilation of the results, in addition to all of the comments.

Crossing Guards (Statements of Fact in response to public inquiries):

Mr. Stathatos reported that all but four to five crossing guards have signed on with the new crossing guard company and normally five to six people leave through attrition anyway.

Mayor Hayden indicated that Council received several emails from a Highland Village resident who had questions about the issuance of a contract with All Cities Management Services for crossing guard services. Mr. Meredith or Mr. Stathatos provided statements of fact related to the bid process or legal issues that were raised in those emails.

Legislative Update:

Mr. Stathatos provided a statement of fact to Mayor Hayden as it relates to legislation and the associated potential impact on the Town's Tree Ordinance. Mayor Hayden added that he would like the Town to initiate a resolution, showing the Town's position that protects the environment and trees. In addition, there was council discussion to reach out to the Texas Municipal League, and make it a collective effort with neighboring cities to present the resolution to Austin on the same day. In addition, residents were encouraged to reach out to their state representatives to voice their concerns about the importance of protecting the ordinances that the Town has in place, such as the tree ordinance.

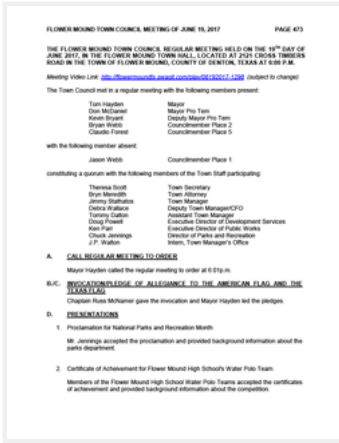
